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Agenda notes for 3rd meeting of EC, NMOOP

1. Background:

National Mission on Oilseeds and Oil Palm (NMOOP) comprises 03 Mini Missions (MM) one each for Oilseeds (MM-I), Oil Palm (MM-II) and Tree Borne Oilseeds (MM-III) was launched from April, 2014. MM-I aims to enhance production of oilseeds from 28.93 tonnes (Average of 11th Plan) to 35.51 million tonnes with a focus on productivity improvement from 1081 kg/ha to 1328 kg/ha. MM-II aims to bring additional area of 1.25 lakh ha under Oil Palm cultivation by end of 2016-17 with increased productivity of Fresh Fruit Bunches (FFBs) from 4927 kg/ha to 15000 kg/ha. MM – III aims to provide elite planting material, awareness campaign for collection and procurement of seeds of Tree Borne Oilseeds (TBOs).

NMOOP envisage provision for Executive Committee (EC) under the Chairmanship of Union Minister of Agriculture to monitor the programmes at National level. The composition and ToR of EC are given below:

1.2 Terms of Reference (ToR):

EC will be the policy making body providing suitable directives and guidance to the Mission and reviewing the overall progress and development of the Mission. EC will lay down and also amend the operational guidelines regarding day to day operation of the Mission. EC will be empowered to include/exclude a new state/agency/organization under the Mission from Governments Central/State/Semi Government/ Government Autonomous/ Cooperatives/PSUs. The Chairman, EC is empowered to take decision on file subject to ratification by the Committee. EC is also empowered to amend/ratify the decisions taken by the Standing Committee of NMOOP and will meet at least twice a year.

Agenda Item 1: Approval/adoption of minutes of second meeting of EC:

The proceedings of second meeting of EC held on 26th August, 2015 under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Agriculture Minister, were circulated to Members, State Departments of Agriculture/Horticulture, ICAR and Agencies vide note no. 4-4/2015-NMOOP (Coord.)/OS dated 7th September, 2015 (*Annexure-I*). Since, no comments have been received, the minutes may be approved.

Approval of EC, NMOOP is solicited for adoption of aforesaid minutes.



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Agenda Item 2: Review of follow-up action on second meeting of EC:

The status of action points emerged during the 2nd meeting of EC and action taken by the Oilseeds Division is given below:

Therefore, the funding pattern of 75:25 between Central and State Government was approved by CCEA, which has subsequently changed to 60:40 for General category of States and 90:10 for NE & Himalayan States from 2015-16.

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Agenda Item 3: Review of progress of implementation of NMOOP during 2015-16:

NMOOP was under implementation in 28 states for Oilseeds (24 states), Oil Palm (12 states) and Tree Borne Oilseeds (8 states). In addition a series of National events were also organized at the level of DAC&FW. The Mini Mission wise progress of key interventions and national events are given below:-

3.2. National events:-

- Kisan Mela on soybean was organized at ICAR-Directorate of Soybean Research, Indore on 25th August, 2015.
- Kisan Mela on groundnut was organized at ICAR-Directorate of Groundnut Research, Junagarh on 10th September, 2015.
- National Seminar on TBOs was organized on 15-16th October, 2015 at CAFRI, Jhansi.
- Video Conference with 10 major Rabi oilseed growing States was held on 5th November, 2015.
- One day workshop on "Soybean against Yellow Mosaic and other Biotic and Abiotic Stresses" conducted by Directorate of Soybean Research, Indore on 15th February, 2016 under NMOOP. Advisory has been issued to the soybean growing states.
- One day mustard fair was organized by Directorate of Mustard Rapeseed Research, Bharatpur at Sewar on 18th February, 2016 under NMOOP.
- Participation with a stall in Krishi Unnati Mela organized from 19th to 21st March, 2016 at IARI, Pusa, New Delhi.
- Monitored NMOOP implementation through field visit in the state of UP (13-15 July 2015), Maharashtra (27-29 July 2015), Chhattisgarh (3-6 August 2015), Karnataka (5-7 Sept 2015), Odisha (28-30 Sept 2015), Gujarat (27-28 Oct 2015), Rajasthan (4-6th January, 2016), Jharkhand (11-13th January 2016) by the officials of Oilseeds Division. One Video Conference (5.11.2015) was also organized during the year.
- West Bengal state was awarded with Krishi Karman Award - 2014-15.

3.3. In addition to above mentioned national events, the progress of implementation was reviewed through the video conference, National Level Monitoring Team (NLMT) and individual officers of Oil Seeds Division in the states of Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Rajasthan.

3.4. Delayed and deficit monsoon had adversely affected both the coverage and production of oilseeds during 2015-16. An area coverage of 261.34 lakh ha and production of 253.04 lakh tonnes was recorded as against normal (2010-14) coverage of 268.62 lakh ha and production of 305.29 lakh tonnes and targets of 320.86 lakh tones decided for 2015-16.

3.5. As against the BE of Rs. 353.00 crores, a sum of Rs. 305.81 crores were released to the programme implementing States/Agencies during 2015-16. State and agency wise details are at *Annexure-IV*.

Agenda Item 4: Status of Implementation of NMOOP during 2016-17:

As against the outlay of Rs. 958.54 crores approved by CCEA, BE of Rs. 500.00 crores have been allocated for implementation of programme and activities of NMOOP during 2016-17. Annual Action Plan of 27 states with a total allocation of Rs. 463.48 crores have been approved under MM-I for Oilseeds (24 states with Rs. 377.77 crores), MM-II on Oil Palm (12 states with Rs. 80.26 crores) and MM-III on TBOs (10 states with Rs. 5.45 crores). In addition, Annual Action Plans of R&D institutions of ICAR, SAUs and ICRISAT for continuation of ongoing nine research projects and demonstrations at farmers fields (Rs. 13.80 crores) and Central Agencies namely NSC, HIL, NAFED, KRIBHCO, IFFDC involved in seed production & distribution including seed minikits (Rs. 100.49 crores) have also been approved. A sum of Rs. 227.79 lakhs has already been released to the programme implementing states/agencies. State and agency-wise details of allocations and releases made so far is *Annexure-V*. However, summary is given below:

Agenda item 5: Ratification of the decisions taken on file.

To facilitate timely implementation of National Mission on Oilseeds and Oil Palm (NMOOP) the following decisions were taken on file with the approval of Hon'ble AM & Chairman, EC, NMOOP subject to ratification by EC.

5.1. Enhancement of subsidy norms for supply of certified seeds:

Para no.9.1.1.4 of the operational guidelines of NMOOP has been amended with the approval of AM and Chairman, Executive Committee of NMOOP for increasing the financial assistance for distribution of varieties/hybrids of oilseeds not older than 10 years (except sesamum) from Rs.1200/qtl to Rs.2500/qtl and from Rs.2,500/qtl to Rs.5,000/qtl. for hybrid seeds of sunflower, safflower, rapeseed-mustard, castor. The subsidy on certified seed of sesame has been increased from Rs. 1200/qtl to Rs. 5000/qtl in view of larger export and higher prevailing prices of sesame in the market. The revised rates are effective from 1st April, 2016. Copy of the corrigendum order is at *Annexure-VI*.

5.2. Enhancement of subsidy on supply of water carrying pipes:

Para No.9.1.2.8 of the operational guidelines of NMOOP has been amended with the approval of AM and Chairman, EC, NMOOP for enhancement of assistance on water carrying pipes from 50% of the cost limited to Rs.25/-per metre for all types of pipes to 50% of the cost limited to Rs.50/-per metre for HDPE pipes, Rs.35/- per metre for PVC pipes and Rs.20/- per metre for HDPE laminated woven lay flat tubes. The revised rates are effective from 1st April, 2016. Copy of the corrigendum is at *Annexure-II*.

5.3. Inclusion of seed nursery of TBOs:

A new para 9.3.1.1A has been incorporated in guidelines of NMOOP for providing support for nursery of TBOs with the approval of Agriculture Minister and Chairman, EC, NMOOP. Support will be provided to R&D institutes of ICAR, CSIR, ICFRE, SAUs, Cooperatives/Self Help Groups/FIGs/FPOs/Corporate bodies/private companies/PSUs/NGOs for establishment of nursery for TBOs. Project based 100% direct assistance will be available for R&D Institutes of ICAR, CSIR, ICFRE, SAUs etc and through State Government in case of Cooperatives/Self Help Groups/FIGs/FPOs/PSUs/NGOs. 50% assistance through State Governments for private companies/corporate bodies. Copy of the order is at *Annexure-VII*.

5.4. **Age relaxation of oilseeds varieties:**

The operational guidelines of NMOOP envisage provision for subsidy on distribution of certified seeds of the varieties/hybrids, which are not older than 10 years. Subsequently, a provision was also incorporated in the guidelines for use of varieties/hybrids, which are not older than 10 years under demonstration. Based on the request of the State Governments a joint proposal of NFSM and NMOOP was considered on file. The considered opinion of ICAR was also obtained in the matter. Age limit of the varieties/hybrids of oilseeds was also relaxed along with pulses from 10 to 15 years under seed distribution and cluster demonstration except Front Line Demonstration for next 03 years i.e. 2016-17 to 2018-19. A copy of the order is at *Annexure-III*. The Standing Committee was also apprised about the above mentioned changes in the guidelines in its 1st meeting held on 4th August, 2016.

5.5 **Involvement of National Fertilizer Ltd. (NFL) in seed production and distribution**

It has been decided with the approval of Hon'ble AM and Chairman EC that National Fertilizer Ltd. (NFL) may be involved in seed production and distribution through Hindustan Insecticides Ltd.(HIL) from 2017-18 subject to ratification by EC. A copy of the letter issued to NFL is at *Annexure – VIII*.

Ratification in respect of Item 5.1 to 5.5 is solicited from the Executive Committee of NMOOP.

Agenda item 6: Other initiatives/decisions taken:

6.1 Possibilities of Oil Palm cultivation in Bodoland:

In order to explore possibilities of oil palm cultivation in 4 districts of Bodoland, a D.O. letter has been written by Joint Secretary (OS) to Principal Secretary of Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC) vide letter no. 3-07/2015-OP dated 08.10.2015. Director, IOPR, Pedavegi has been assigned to conduct a brief survey/study in consultation with officials of BTC for feasibility of taking up oil palm cultivation in at least 5,000-10,000 ha area in districts of Bodoland. An amount of Rs.3.50 lakh has been allocated and Rs.1.77 lakhs has been released for the purpose.

6.2. Proposals for procurement of FFBS under MIS:

In order to protect the farmers from distress, Govt. of India is implementing the Market Intervention Scheme (MIS) for providing financial support to the oil palm growers. All State Governments concerned have been requested to submit a proposal for procurement of fresh fruit bunches (FFBs) of oil palm under MIS during the year 2015-16 to this Department for consideration vide letter dated 16.02.2016. Govt. of Andhra Pradesh was already submitted a proposal to the Ministry, which is considered for procurement of FFBS 1,14,963 MT of oil palm @ Rs. 7,888/-per MT of FAQ of oil palm. State Governments of Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Mizoram and Odisha have also been submitted their proposals to this Department, which are under consideration in Cooperation Division.

6.3 Assessment of performance of indigenous and imported seedling:

A study has been assigned to Directorate of E&S for assessment of performance of indigenous and imported seedling in three major oil palm growing States viz, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu. Dte. of E&S has assigned this study for their centre of ISEC, Bangalore. A meeting was organized on 22nd & 23rd December, 2015 by Dte. of E&S for finalization of research methodology of the studies. As per their minutes of the meeting, the report of the study will be submitted by end of July, 2016.

6.4 Measures to increase Oil Palm area and production in India:

A draft note for Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) on "Measures to increase oil palm area and production in India" has been prepared. The CCEA Note comprising three proposals viz. Ist for imposing a cess of 0.5% on import of crude palm oil (CPO) and refined palm oil for creation of "Edible Oil Development Fund" (EODF), IInd for

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relaxation of land ceiling limit for oil palm cultivation under NMOOP and IIIrd for revision of norms of assistance under Mini Mission-II (MM-II) of NMOOP has been submitted on 7th September, 2016 to the Cabinet Secretariat along with the comments of the concerned Ministries/ Departments and Divisions of DAC&FW including IFD.

6.5 Visit of an Indian Delegation to Malaysia:

An Indian Delegation headed by Joint Secretary (Oilseeds), DAC & FW comprising 08 members from the States of Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Nagaland, Odisha and 01 Officer from DAC & FW has visited Malaysia from 22nd – 25th August, 2016 for better understanding of their oil palm cultivation in Malaysia. The following action points emerged during the visit have been circulated to the concerned state and other stakeholders on 7th September, 2016:

- Adopting high denting plantation of oil palm.
- Germ plasm exchange between Malaysia and India
- Improve nurseries to supply quality planting material instead of being dependant on import
- Import of latest variety, which is high yielding (Calyx, Guthini, etc.)
- Creation of awareness

6.6 Integration of Tree Borne Oilseeds (TBOs) programme with Agro-forestry Mission

Secretary, AC&FW and Chairman, Standing Committee (SC) of NMOOP during first meeting of SC suggested that programme of TBOs could be converged with Agro-forestry Mission of RFS Division, mainly for bio-mass production and oil as a byproduct. Accordingly, the RFS Division has been requested vide this Divisional letter dated 3rd October, 2016 to examine the matter (Annexure-IX).

This is for kind information of EC, NMOOP.

Agenda Item 7: Area coverage and crop prospect of oilseeds during Kharif-2016

The National production target of 350 lakh tones of oilseeds has been fixed for 2016-17. An area coverage of 190.31 lakh ha has been reported up to 6th Oct., 2016 as against the normal coverage of 182.42 lakh ha (2010-2015), 185.19 lakh ha (Kharif-2015) and highest coverage of 194.01 lakh ha during kharif, 2013 during the same period. The crop and state wise position is given below in Table 5:

Crop conditions are normal in major oilseeds growing states except damage of soybean crop by excess rains in Karnataka (about 1.00 lakh ha) & Maharashtra (about 12,000 ha) and adverse impact of long dry spell in groundnut in the state of Karnataka (about 4.00 lakh ha) and Andhra Pradesh (about 2.00 lakh ha). Higher coverage and better prospects during crop season in majority of the oilseeds growing states indicates higher production of oilseeds during kharif 2016 than kharif 2014 and kharif 2015.



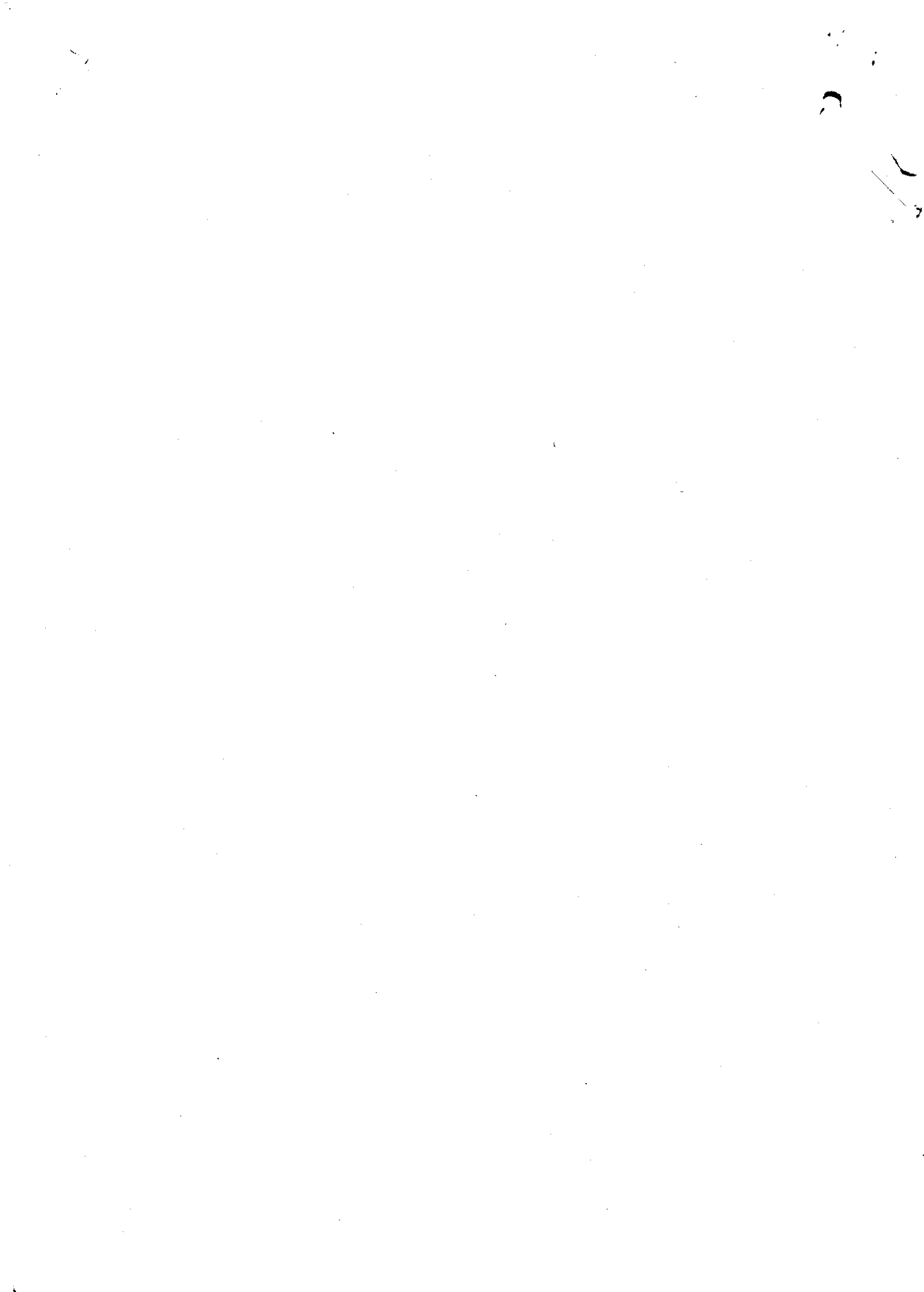

**Minutes of the 2nd Meeting of the Executive Committee (EC) of National Mission
on Oilseeds and Oil Palm (NMOOP) held on 26th August, 2015 at Krishi Bhavan,
New Delhi**

The 2nd meeting of the Executive Committee (EC) of NMOOP was held on 26th August, 2015 under the chairmanship of Dr. Sanjeev Baliyan, Minister of State in the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, at ICAR Committee Room No.1, Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi. The list of participants is annexed. Welcoming the chairman and other members of the committee, Joint Secretary (OS) gave a brief background of NMOOP and its current activities. He informed about the recent initiatives like inclusion of all NE States with a greater focus on oil palm development, funding for adaptive research for dissemination of new technologies, enhancement of amount of Krishi Karman Award etc. Thereafter, agenda items of the meeting were considered as under:

1. Agenda Item 1: Approval/adoption of minutes of first meeting of EC: **Approved.**
2. Agenda Item 2: Follow up action on first meeting of EC: **Noted.**
3. Agenda Item 3: Achievement of NMOOP during 2014-15: **Noted.**
4. Agenda Item 4: Status of Implementation during 2015-16: While deliberating upon the change of pattern of funding from 75:25 between Central and State Government to 50:50 basis and release of funds through State Governments, it was observed that States are finding it difficult to give matching share. In addition, release of funds through treasury is an another concern in implementation of the programme. Therefore, representatives of the States requested for release of funds through State notified agencies instead of State treasuries.
5. **Agenda item 5: Ex-post facto approval:**
 - 5.1 Inclusion of funding for adaptive research for dissemination of new technologies: **Approved.**
 - 5.2 Enhancement of amount of Krishi Karman Awards: **Approved.**

7. **Presentation by the States:** Four presentations were made by the States of UP, TN, Assam and Mizoram. The highlights and issues raised by the states are summarized as under:

7.1 Uttar Pradesh: A detailed presentation was made by Joint Director of Agriculture, representative of UP covering state profile, potential oilseed growing areas, crop wise constraints in oilseed production, strategies to meet the challenges. He also informed that a top-up subsidy of Rs. 88/- per kg is being given by the State Government over and above the subsidy of Rs. 12/- per kg available under NMOOP to motivate the oilseed growers and to bring an additional area of 1 lakh ha under sesame cultivation in Bundelkhand during Kharif-2015. The following problems and issues were proposed by the State for consideration:

- Increase in rate of seed distribution subsidy
- Revision of rate of assistance on supply of water carrying pipes, a key input for productivity improvement of oilseeds.
- Enhancement of import duty on edible oils particularly at the time of harvesting.
- Improvement in oil extraction efficiencies in the existing units.

7.1.1 The Chairman desired to know the mechanism adopted by the State Government to ensure the payment of seed subsidy to the farmers and showed his concern about the quality of seed supplied to the farmers.

7.1.2 JDA informed that seed subsidy in Rabi 2015 will be transferred to the farmer's accounts through RTGS.

7.1.3 As regards the quality of seed, Joint Secretary (Seeds) informed that Secretary (A&C) has written to Chief Secretaries of all States emphasizing on preparation of long term plan for supply of certified seeds. MoU with Central / State Seed Agencies and other established seed producers may be signed, if required.

7.1.4 The Chairman desired that a separate meeting may be organized to develop modalities for ensuring supply of quality seed to the farmers.

7.2 **Tamil Nadu:** A presentation was made by the State representative covering state profile including their contribution in oilseed production and status of implementation of NMOOP in the State. He informed that TMV-7, an old variety of groundnut is most popular among the farmers and keeping in view the huge cost of seeds alone, age relaxation of varieties of oilseeds may be considered beyond 15 years. He also requested for supply of seeds of K-6 variety of groundnut.

7.3 **Assam:** A detailed presentation was made by the Director of Agriculture, Assam covering state profile including their contribution in oilseed production and status of implementation of NMOOP in the State. He also shared the performance of seed minikits of JD-6 (Pusa Mahak) supplied to the States first time during Rabi 2014-15 under NMOOP. An average yield of 985 kg/ha was recorded with JD-6 during 2014-15 as against the state average yield of 591 kg/ha. He also requested for increasing the supply of minikits of this variety during current year. It was also informed that an additional area of around 23000 ha rice fallows was brought under oilseeds cultivation during Rabi 2014-15 and there is a large scope for bringing more rice fallows under Rabi oilseeds. The following problems and issues were proposed for consideration:

- Enhancement of subsidy on seed upto 75% of sale price of NSC and 75% on irrigation tools and farm implements.
- Revision of pattern of funding from 50:50 to 90:10.

7.4 **Mizoram:** A detailed presentation on oil palm development programme in Mizoram was made by Director of Agriculture, Mizoram covering organization structure, involvement of private companies, year wise area coverage under oil palm, yield of FFBs and the price paid to the oil palm

growers. Wide range of topography/terrain covered under oil palm plantation, planting material and oil palm processing units was also shared. The following problems and issues were proposed for consideration:

- Clearance of proposal for establishment of seed gardens submitted to DAC through IIOR, Pedavegi.
- Revision of funding pattern from 50:50 to 90:10, if not 100%.
- Support for construction of roads.
- Cost of transportation of seedlings from nursery to farmers field.

7.4.1 As regards, the proposal for seed garden is concerned, it was informed by the scientist of IIOR that no such proposal is pending with them. Joint Secretary (OS) suggested that a copy of the proposal may be forwarded to DAC for taking appropriate action in the matter.

8. The Chairman desired that States should supply only good quality seeds, for which modalities may be strengthened. He wanted States to study whether farmers adopt new technologies and seeds in years after the demonstrations are held.

9. Action Points

9.1 The action points that emerged after the deliberations are summarized as under:

- To organize a meeting for preparation of modalities for ensuring the supply of quality seeds to the farmers. **(Action: Seed Division, DAC).**
- To examine the proposal for revision of rate of assistance on supply of water carrying pipes. **(Action: Oil Seed Division, DAC).**
- To examine the proposal for change of funding pattern and release of funds through State notified agencies.

(Action: Oil Seed Division, DAC).

- To examine the proposal for age relaxation of varieties of oilseeds beyond 15 years.

(Action: Oil Seed Division, DAC).

- Supply of additional minikits of JD-6 (Pusa Mahak) of mustard to Assam and K-6 variety of groundnut to Tamil Nadu.

In the operational Guidelines of National Mission on Oilseeds and Oil Palm (NMOOP) in para no. 9.1.2.8, the sentence from “@ 50% of the cost limited to Rs. 25/- per meter with maximum limit of unit length of 600 meters and cost of Rs. 15,000/- per farmer for water carrying pipes of all types i.e. PVC, HDPE etc, and of all sizes” has been replaced with the approval of competent authority as under:

“@ 50% of the cost limited to Rs.50/- per meter for HDPE pipes, Rs. 35/- per meter for PVC pipes and Rs. 20/- per meter for HDPE laminated woven lay flat tubes with maximum ceiling of Rs. 15000/- per farmer / beneficiary for water carrying pipes”.

The revised rates will be effective from 1st April, 2016.



Sir/Madam,

In the operational Guidelines of National Mission on Oilseeds and Oil Palm (NMOOP) in para no. 9.1.1.4, the sentence from “ Assistance @ 50% of the cost limited to ₹ 1200/- per quintal for varieties of oilseeds not older than 10 years. For hybrids, assistance for distribution of certified hybrids seeds @ 50% of the cost limited to ₹ 2500/- per quintal for hybrids of oilseeds not older than 10 years” has been replaced with the approval of cometenent authority as under:-

“Assistance @ 50% of the cost limited to ₹ 2500/- per quintal for varieties of oilseeds not older than 10 years except sesamum. Assistance for distribution of hybrid seeds of sunflower, safflower, rapseed-mustard, castor and variety of sesamum will be @ 50% of the cost limited to ₹ 5000/- per quintal, which are not older than 10 years”.

The revised rate will be effective from 1st April, 2016.
